"FOUR"

Is a common golf term that is used when one strikes a ball and it has the potential for harming another person.

At the Bristlecone Bowmen Archery Golf Shoots yelling four will get you kicked off the course. The Ely club held 5 Archery Golf Shoots in 2011, and plans on holding a 5 shoot league during the summer of 2012.

The first 4 are 9 hole rounds and the last an 18 hole Championship with Bar-B-Que and award ceremony. I started this game last year and had no idea the response we would have. We had over 50 shooters at one tournament.

This is THE FUNNEST thing you will every do with stick and string. Here is how we play. Our club members volunteer to put the shoot on, they set up the course and make trophies if they choose. We play the game at the White Pine County Golf Course. You start off somewhere near the Tee Box of the normal course and the Target is placed near the hole, usually on the right or left hand side. Your shot can range anywhere from 50 yards to 500 yards. Of course the Range Captain inspects the range before the game begins. The rules vary from shoot to shoot on scoring but the first two rules are SAFETY and FUN. The classes are Adult, Youth, and Cub. We split up the men from the women, and the compound from the recurve / longbows. We do a closest to the hole contest which I'm not happy to say the women won more than the men.

Some amazing stories seem to come from these shoots. I remember one shot from a youth at a Catalina goat at 125 yards plus where he got a hole in 1, another from 2 different women that shot 2 completely different bows, arrows, weights and styles that shot at a mountain goat at 340 yards that came up a bit short but the arrows were touching one another at nearly 300 yards. And another shot at a bedded elk from 490 yards that missed a hole in one by just 19 yards. I guarantee you if you try this you will have fun. The dates are pretty much set for 2012 they are April 29th, July 7th, August 19th, Sept 16th and Sept 30th. But are subject to change as the golf course sets its schedule.

We have a face book page to keep up with any changes but I'm sure we will see you at the shoots.

A MESSAGE FROM:**THE FIRST VICE PRESIDENT OF THE NEVADA BOW HUNTERS ASSOCIATION**

With the constitutional changes we have made in the last year and which are now in full effect, I have gone from being the last Northern Vice President of the NBHA to serving as the First Vice President of the NBHA...

My self proclaimed position as representative of the mediocre and fair to middling archers. (who are rarely if ever top flight, but who do represent the majority of the folks who attend shoots) has not changed. As such, I am here to give you some perspective on our two day mid winter meeting...

1st, by a very tight vote, finally requiring the President to vote to break the deadlock, the board changed the rule for scoring at the Jamboree. This year the scores will count for both days (they will not start over at zero on Sunday) and highest cumulative score in each division will be the winner. Now my main concern with this was the question of if it would still be top flighted AND 2nd flighted, thus allowing for 2nd flight awards of T-shirts and stuff, which makes it more fun for those who do not shoot in the top flight. The answer is yes, there will still be top and 2nd flight. On Sunday, top flighted folks will shoot with their competition and 2nd flighted folks will shoot with theirs...

2nd, by a slim majority, it was decided that one of the donated bows for the Jamboree would be used as 1st prize in the handicapped shoot off of the Safari Round for the adults. Youth and Cubs will be shooting for a separate award. This is important to you fair to middling and mediocre shooters like me as the handicapping levels the playing field with all shooters and all styles. So when you shoot the Safari round, remember to turn your cards in and don't forget to bring your bow to the BBQ, as that is where we will have the shoot-off ! Remember, everyone is in the hunt on this one and has an equal chance of winning with their individual skill levels...

Last but not least, we decided that in an effort to improve membership, we would have a booth at both the Wild Sheep show in Reno and the RMEF elk camp in Las Vegas. If you would like to get into the Sheep show and help with the booth please contact me at 775-771-5845, I am looking for volunteers...

Frank Roof will be coordinating the booth for the Elk show in Vegas...

Now there were a lot more issues discussed and decided, but I will leave those to Lucy and Jessica to address. One of my other major duties at this meeting was to create the NBHA calendar for 2012, it is listed below (or wherever Jessica can find a place to fit it into the newsletter)

Mid Winter Meeting

The NBHA directors met on Dec. 10 and 11 to make decisions for upcoming year. This was the first meeting under the new structure with larger board that included club representatives. For most of 2 days we debated, exchanged ideas, and enjoyed the camaraderie of fellow archery addicts. Some of the highlights are described in this newsletter. Minutes are posted on the NBHA website if you would like to read more detail.

Club/Shop Challenge

One of the most significant changes that the board enacted was a by-law change that established a club/shop challenge. The prize is significant and here is how it works:

Teams. Each club or shop may sponsor 5 person teams that compete throughout the season. Teams must include at least one woman, one finger shooter, one senior or master senior, and one young adult, youth, or cub. Substitutions are allowed so that a club may send one team to one tournament and a completely different team to a different tournament.

Qualifying Tournaments. All 5 NBHA sponsored tournaments qualify – State Indoor Mail-in, State Outdoor, Marked 3-D, Jamboree, and Sagebrush Classic traditional tournament. Each affiliate club may designate one outdoor tournament and one indoor tournament as qualifying tournaments. Teams must compete a minimum of 6 tournaments. If a club elects to sponsor teams at more tournaments, the clubs' best 6 scores will be counted.

Entry Fees. Entry fees are \$20 per team per tournament. These must be paid to the NBHA representative at each tournament, and team members must be declared before the tournament begins.

Awards. A revolving trophy will go to the team that wins each tournament. That trophy will stay with the winning club until the next tournament. At the conclusion of the Jamboree, the winner will take the trophy and keep it until next year. AND, the winning club at the conclusion of the Jamboree will receive all of the entry fees in the form of a target order. We anticipate that this award will be of the magnitude of a Rinehart Lying Down Elk or a selection of smaller targets.

Sponsorship. Clubs and shops may sponsor teams at whatever level they choose. We suggest that the club pays the entry fees and we hope that the clubs supply team members with T-shirts or other team promotional items. We understand that the financial situation of each team is vastly different and realize that sponsorship will mean different things to different clubs.

Scoring. Team member points will be totaled at each shoot. Then winning teams will be ranked and points will be given depending upon rank. 1st = 30 points, 2nd = 29 points, 3rd = 28 points, etc. Points will be accumulated through-out the season. For each team, the best 6 tournaments will be counted.

Strategy. It is our hope that sponsoring clubs and shops will strategize both regarding team make-up and shoots at which they field a team. Clubs should choose team members carefully depending upon the tournament format and the ability of team members. Team members are not required to shoot together. A list of qualifying tournaments is included on the flyer included with this newsletter.

NBHA All-Around Tournament

NBHA will again sponsor an all-around tournament. Qualifying tournaments include the State Indoor Mail-in, the State Outdoor, the Marked 3-D, and the Jamboree. Individuals must declare division of competition BEFORE participating in any tournaments. Winner must complete a minimum of 3 tournaments and all scores will be counted, meaning that if a person competes in all 4 tournaments all 4 scores will be counted. Points will be awarded for rank in division with 1st = 10, 2nd = 9, 3rd = 8, and etc.

Ely to Host State Marked 3-D

State Indoor Mail-In

The NBHA Indoor Mail-in Tournament will be held in 4 sites around the state. Ely, Elko, Yerington, and Las Vegas will host the event at dates shown on the calendar. **Remember, this tournament qualifies for the Club/Shop Challenge.** Team must notify the tournament director or and NBHA officer of team make-up and pay team entry fee before shooting.

We will once again shoot a "Nevada 600." The tournament is comprised of a Vegas 300 Round (30 arrows) and an NFAA Indoor Round (60 arrows.) All are shot from 20 yards (10 for cubs and peewees.) This is an NFAA sanctioned tournament and to compete for awards, you must be an NFAA/NBHA member.

This tournament is also a qualifying tournament for the NBHA all-around tournament. Because it is the first of the 2012 NBHA tournaments, participants must declare in which division they will be competing BEFORE shooting.

NBHA Club Representatives – Just a Reminder

Each club is entitled to select one representative for the NBHA Board of Directors. These directors have the same voting power as the statewide elected directors.

Please, we want to hear from your club. Fallon, Yerington, Elko, Ely, and Las Vegas were represented at the director meeting. My thanks to those clubs for sending representatives. The creativity and insight those directors contributed was a great addition. If your club did not send a representative, and would like to do so, please let Jessica or Lucy know. We do have some director meetings in the near future via conference call and would like to include your club.

Changes in Jamboree

The board made decisions regarding the 2012 Jamboree. It will be held on June 16 and 17 at Perdiz in Eureka. For the past few years, when we flighted competitors on Sunday at the Jamboree, we have started scores from Zero. Saturday scores were only used to establish flights. The board reversed that policy in a tie vote broken by president Lucy Rechel. The sum of Saturday and Sunday scores will be used to determine the winners of the Jamboree. This is always a controversial issue. The main reason the start over on Sunday rule was established was to eliminate the possibility of cheaters getting such a substantial lead on Saturday that it was impossible to overtake them on Sunday. **PLEASE, REMEMBER THERE ARE OTHER WAYS TO DISCOURAGE CHEATING. THE FIRST AND MOST EFFECTIVE IS TO SHOOT WITH THOSE YOU SUSPECT OF CHEATING. THE SECOND IS TO UTILIZE THE ESTABLISHED PROTEST PROCEDURE.**

We also agreed to include more competitors in the top flight in the larger classes on Sunday. The top flight will be broken into 2 shooter groups to ensure smooth flow on the course. Further details will be published in the shoot flyer later in the year.

TOUGH ENOUGH TO SHOOT PINK

Last summer the NBHA board agreed to establish a program to support archers fighting breast cancer. Jessica Gorges and Anita Treants have headed this project and the results to date are impressive. A total of \$800 has been raised. We decided to entrust the money to a non-profit organization in Elko. We can specify who receives the money. Any Nevada archer who is struggling against breast cancer can apply for money to help with expenses not covered by insurance – travel for treatments, things not covered by insurance, etc.

We will be soliciting money for this worthy cause during our next tournament year. T-shirt, Sweatshirts, and pink arrows are all available and if your club would like to host a shoot or hold a novelty shoot with proceeds going to **Tough Enough to Shoot Pink**, your support would be much appreciated.

State Indoor Tournament

We've been enjoying shooting and doing some renovating of our Club House in anticipation of hosting the NFAA Southwest Sectional Outdoor Championship this year. All archers from the seven states comprising the 'NFAA Southwestern Section' will be warmly received at our range on May 19th & 20th for the two day shoot. Of course, everyone is also invited to our signature 'Silver Dollar Shoot' on April 14th & 15th, or any other shoot on our shoot schedule.

While up at our range, it occurred to me what a wonderful resource it is for archers to have a viable Club or Organization available to them. Our old and new members were bringing up prospective members and introducing them to the sport. By this way, archers were exposed to the camaraderie of fellow enthusiasts and the different types of equipment and styles of shooting that are available to enjoy – along with a lot of free advice of course. But seriously, how many times have you heard; how do I get started, what kind of equipment do I need, where do I shoot? This is what we're all about.

Speaking of equipment, it seems appropriate to mention a couple of things at the beginning of the year. Especially if you're a 'closet archer', the biggest thing you can do is: "don't procrastinate"! Get your equipment out well before you plan to hunt or compete so you have time to get everything in order. Make sure your string hasn't stretched and, along with the D-loop, has not frayed or been cut. Check for loose screws and bolts. Shoot some arrows and check for proper flight. Look at the fletching and arrow rest for marks that might indicate improper contact. Make sure your release is functioning smoothly. Get comfortable with your site and proper marks for aiming. Re-enforce being at ease with a consistent anchor point. Then, go out and enjoy.
